'My favourite thing about spring is seeing animals walk about with their new born babies and all the new nature to light up winter sadness.' Jasmine- Y3


'Spring is the season of hope because all the nature comes out and makes people smile - its a sign of new beginnings! I like spring because it is beautiful'
